But the Good News is that- Spring has sprung! The temperature is rising, the sun is shining and some of the plants are beginning to renew themselves. There is a refreshing going on. Wikipedia describes Spring in the following way: "Spring and springtime refer to the season, and also to ideas of rebirth, rejuvenation, renewal, resurrection, and regrowth." There is a joy in seeing the renewal and new greening of plants and is always a great time of refreshing and renewal. And this is what God's creation needs.

I wonder if this type of refreshing is not something the Church needs also? For the past year, we have been going through the Pandemic. Although it continues to be an issue, it is getting better with all the vaccinations and as people are careful about what they are doing. In many ways, we as the Church, have put ourselves on a precautionary hold. As a result, we have had time to develop new habits in the way we gather, in the way we witness and in the way we live. Maybe, what we need is an intentional effort to cautiously break some of the habits we have become comfortable with and set May 2nd as REFRESH SUNDAY. This would be a time for us to Regather as a Church family for In Person Worship and Fellowship.




