"Come and See"

I would like to start out this month reflecting on a well-known scripture verse, that I think we all take too lightly. Matthew 28:19-20 says to "go and make disciples." Do you remember the days when the people from the church would "go" into the community and tell others about Jesus or meet needs in the community? Maybe this looked like "door to door" witnessing, maybe it looked like neighborhood block parties, maybe it looked like neighbors helping neighbors. When did this kind of outreach stop? We went door to door a few months ago passing out fliers for VBS, to try and get people to "come and see". But the last time I remember actually going door to door was when I was about 9 years old and my parents were helping to start a new church plant in Liverpool, TX. (Even then, it wasn't sharing the gospel, it was inviting people to "come and see".) Churches have been trying to get people to "come and see" for way too long. We have been trying to provide entertainment to invite people to "come and see". The scripture clearly says to "go and tell". I believe that our community does NOT need to be entertained. I believe our community needs to hear the Gospel of Jesus Christ. People are struggling in every way imaginable, except for entertainment, and we are not even trying to help those in need. Even worse, I think we have even stopped asking people to "come and see". Just hoping more people will show up in church will not help fill the pews. People need to hear and see the Gospel being presented to them in their own neighborhoods. At least ask them to "come and see" but remember that the scripture commands us to "go and tell". How can you be a part of this commission from the Lord this month?
